	classroom rule by chewing gum or having

Non-compliance/Disrespect	Brief or low intensity failure or hesitation in
	responding to adult requests. This includes
	delayed response to authority, gestures,
	unwilling to follow directives like cell phone
	use, talking or being out of seat
Student Conflict	Minor misunderstanding between students
	that does not include any physical contact
Other	Any other minor problems and/or behaviors
	that do not fall within the above categories
	(sleeping in class, cheating, not prepared,
